

How Shall We Vote On The ABC Issue On Tuesday, August 8th? There are some who have already definitely made up their minds on the issue; but there are also others who are still undecided. The following questions and statements are to help the undecided to decide:

- The letters A.B.C. stand for Alcoholic Beverage Control. The question arises "What do the ABC Store and the ABC Board control?"
 - 1. Do they control the one who drinks alcohol so that he does not become a highway menace?
 - 2. Do they control the man who drinks alcohol so that he does not become an "Alcoholic" (Problem Drinker)?
 - 3. Do they so control the "Bootleggers" that they put the "Bootleggers" completely out of business? If this is accomplished, where do men get their liquor from after the legalized liquor stores close? If the ABC Board can eliminate the "Bootlegger", why can't this be done without an ABC Store?
- In regards to the matter of the thousands of dollars which some claim are spent from this county in Chowan and Pasquotank Counties via ABC Stores in Edenton and Elizabeth City.
- 1. Isn't it true that the majority of these thousands spent goes to the brewers outside of these counties and outside our state and goes to the distributors outside these counties and to many distributors outside our state?
- 2. Just how many "thousands" do Chowan and Pasquotank Counties receive in taxes from the ABC Stores which go directly to their. schools? Why have not the forces for the ABC Board and the ABC Store given to us these facts?
- 3. Just how many 'thousands" (if our schools would receive even one thousand) of dollars have the forces for the establishment of an ABC Board and an ABC Store estimated that our schools would receive? (The agreed upon rate of division of taxes from the ABC Store after expenses—including the salaries of one or two ABC Store clerks would be divided 50% for the Town of Hertford and 50% for the county schools). How much money in taxes would be left for the schools?

- HI. In regards to the legal and moral aspect involved in the establishment of an ABC Store.
 - 1. Why does the establishing of an ABC Store involve an election? Why can't one be erected without a popular vote as are department stores, filling stations, hardware stores, etc., unless a legal and moral issue issue is involved?
 - 2. Why did the privilege of separating Hertford from the county for voting on the establishment of an ABC Store require a special law from the N. C. Senate and House if there is no legal or moral aspect involved?
 - 3. Do not all of us agree that that which is declared legal should be that which helps and protects the general welfare of the people?
 - 4. Why do many people say, "If this were an election to wipe alcohol out of the world, I would vote it out!" if these do not see the potential evil in it?
 - 5. If we admit that there is potential evil in the use of alcohol as a beverage, then we must ask ourselves, "Is it ever right to legalize that which encurages and makes possible wrong-doing?"
- IV. In regards to influence.
 - 1. If this ABC Store is brought to our town, 'are we not saying to our youth, "This alcohol is alright as a beverage . . . We recommend it to you?" Can we tell our youth this when we are told that it is estimated that 1 out of every 12 persons who takes his first drink this year will become an alcoholic?
 - 2. How much value do you place on a human life? What amount of money will you accept to sell another human being into slavery-slavery to alcohol?
