**MINUTES OF MEETING BOARD OF EDUCATION**  
The Perquimans County Board of Education met in special session Friday, July 28, 1961. All members present.  
Mr. John Hall and Mr. Silas Wheedbee, attorneys for the Board, were present to offer legal advice concerning acquisition of a school site at Perquimans Union School.  
In a joint meeting with the owners and/or attorneys representing the owners of the S. P. Jessup property, the parties to the condemnation proceedings agreed to submit the matter of the purchase price to be paid for the land to the Board of County Commissioners for their determination, acting as a board of arbitrators, subject to the Board agreeing to act as such.  
In the event the Board of Commissioners does fix the purchase price to be paid, then the property owners are to deliver a fee simple deed for the property, subject to the existing easement of the Virginia Electric & Power Co., and possession of the property is to be delivered to the Board of Education as soon as the property owners harvest the soybean crop growing thereon, and not later than November 15, 1961. Meanwhile, the condemnation proceedings in the court is continued indefinitely.  
Upon motion made, duly seconded and passed, the Board of Education authorized the chairman to sign for the Board all necessary papers to be prepared by the attorneys in connection

with the above arbitration proceedings.

## How Shall We Vote On The ABC Issue On Tuesday, August 8th?

There are some who have already definitely made up their minds on the issue; but there are also others who are still undecided. The following questions and statements are to help the undecided to decide:

- The letters A.B.C. stand for Alcoholic Beverage Control. The question arises "What do the ABC Store and the ABC Board control?"
  - Do they control the one who drinks alcohol so that he does not become a highway menace?
  - Do they control the man who drinks alcohol so that he does not become an "Alcoholic" (Problem Drinker)?
  - Do they so control the "Bootleggers" that they put the "Bootleggers" completely out of business? If this is accomplished, where do men get their liquor from after the legalized liquor stores close? If the ABC Board can eliminate the "Bootlegger", why can't this be done without an ABC Store?
- In regards to the matter of the thousands of dollars which some claim are spent from this county in Chowan and Pasquotank Counties via ABC Stores in Edenton and Elizabeth City.

  - Why do many people say, "If this were an election to wipe alcohol out of the world, I would vote it out!" if these do not see the potential evil in it?
  - If we admit that there is potential evil in the use of alcohol as a beverage, then we must ask ourselves, "Is it ever right to legalize that which encourages and makes possible wrong-doing?"
- In regards to influence.
  - If this ABC Store is brought to our town, are we not saying to our youth, "This alcohol is alright as a beverage . . . We recommend it to you?" Can we tell our youth this when we are told that it is estimated that 1 out of every 12 persons who takes his first drink this year will become an alcoholic?
