

WTN New Tower Now in Operation

On Saturday, October 21, at 8 P. M. WTN's new high and mighty tower went into operation for the first time with color programming. The new tower, higher than the Empire State Building, towers 1,523 feet above ground. The tower stood 918 feet above ground. Theoretically, the new tower was to increase the grade service area by 38%, however, according to station officials, actual tests with the tower operation has far exceeded expectations. The antenna

on top of the structure is the latest design 12 bay GE batwing antenna. One of the tallest elevator rides in the world is in the new high and mighty tower. 5,200 feet of cable was used in installing the elevator. The two-man elevator will take WTN engineers from the 20 foot level to 1,400 feet in the air where ladders are available for climbing to the topmost part. The elevator has all modern safety controls and is equipped with two-way radio communications between the elevator car and the bottom landing. The new 50 KW GE transmitter in the new building addition is now in operation. The WTN engineering staff and the General Electric Company engi-

neers completed the installation in record time. This new equipment has improved television service to all of Eastern North Carolina. Now over one and one-half million people living in Eastern North Carolina is receiving a stronger, clearer, sharper signal from Channel 7 WTN. **BRIDGE SUPPER** Mrs. V. N. 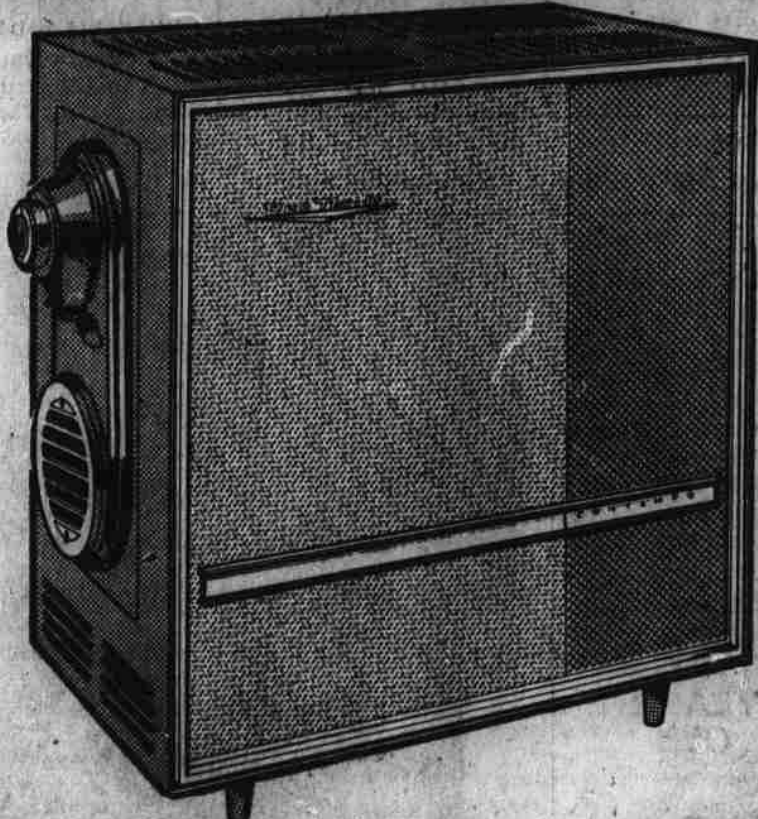

KNOW YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY

John T. Grooms, representative of the Social Security Administration, is in Hertford the second Wednesday of each month at the Perquimans County Court House.

Is your Social Security record correct? If you don't know, Mr. John T. Grooms of the Norfolk, Virginia Social Security Office has some advice on how to find out, and why it is important to do so.

It is really very easy to verify your Social Security record, Mr. Grooms points out. In fact, it is so easy he suggests that everyone examine his record every three years. All you need to do is call, write, or visit your nearest Social Security office and ask for a postcard form on which to request a statement of the earnings reported to your Social Security account. Fill out the postcard form, stamp it, and mail it.

You will receive a statement in a few weeks telling you what earnings have been posted to your account. If the statement does not agree with your records, take it and your own records to your Social Security office, so that steps can be taken to get your Social Security account corrected.
