The October term of Perquim-ans Superior Court adjourned PTA Drive For Friday of last week after the Grand sury had been reconvened and indicted two witnesses for perjury in connection with evidence given in the TO Close Friday case in which John Wilmer Chappell was charged with manslaughter.

The petty jury found Chappell not guilty of the charge, returning the verdict on Thursday. idge Chester Morris ordered the grand jury to reconvene and following questioning of a number of witnesses the grand jury indicted Wayland White, Jr., on charges of perjury and later indicted Lawrence Moffitt on the same charge. Both had been witnesses in the manslaughter case.

Judge Morris, set bond for each of the men at \$5,000 for appearance at the next term of criminal court in Perquimans County. The defendants secured the bond and were released from custody.

What appeared to be an extra session for the court, running into Monday and possibly Tuesday of this week, disappeared when the Court allowed a continuance in the civil action of Carson D. Spivey Adm. vs. Gertrude Boyce, et als.

The final civil action heard during the court term was the case of J. C. Blanchard & Co. vs. Crafton Matthews, Jr. This matter was compromised shortly after noon on Friday, and the term was adjourned following arraignment of Lawrence Mof-
