A second mark is indicated in this passage, and also in He-brews 5:12b-14. This was the inability to assimilate solid food—that is, the greater and more profound ideas of Chrisionity.

Because divisions in church were an evidence of immaturity, it is not surprising stresses unity as a characteristic of maturity. Paul writes of maintaining "the unity of the snirit in the bond of peace" and of "building up the body of Christ until we all attain to the unity of the faith."

In verse 16 of Ephesians 4 From whom the whole bodyupbuilds itself in love . . " the eneral meaning is clear. The writer was speaking of the progress toward maturity of the Christian community church. He uses two terms to refer to it, "growth" and "up-building." Christ is the source of the growth, but the grace he supplies is channeled through the individual members as each works properly. So each makes his own contribution, and all are mutually interdependent, and the "body" as a whole grows in

and through them. As we look around us, can we make an honest claim to having achieved this wonderful goal? Are we really mature in our growth towards Christianity?

As we realize the areas of our hortcomings, let us pray: Our Father, grant us the grace and ourage to grow into mature nanhood and womanhood in the Christian faith, that we may be vorthy members of the body those head is Christ. Amen.
