**Lane Assumes Assembly Post**  
Archie Lane, who was elected sergeant-at-arms in the Legislature. A former representative, Lane has not seen prior service in his position. He will serve in place of the late Joseph Warren, House sergeant-at-arms for many years prior to his death in 1966. Both houses elected their legislative officers on opening day, after being convened by Lt. Gov. Robert Scott in the Senate and Secretary of State Thad Eure in the House. In the House veteran Robeson County Representative David Britt was selected as speaker, while the Senate elected a relative newcomer as president pro tem, Senator Harman Moore of Mecklenburg, who first saw service in the 1965 General Assembly. For the first time in recent memory a strengthened Republican party offered candidates for these two posts, although the result was not in doubt. The House Republican candidate was Rep. Donald Garren of Henderson County, and the Senate candidate Sen. John Osteen of Guilford. Speaker Britt will preside in the House, while his opposite number as president of the Senate will be Lt.
