Minutes, Board of Education

The Perquimans County Board of Education met in regular session on Monday, June 12, 1967 at 8:00 P. M., in the Superintendent's office. All members were present.

The chairman called the meeting to order. Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Board voted to assign each student in the county to the school of his choice as recorded on the free choice forms on file in the Superintendent's office.

The school calendar for 1967-68 was approved by the Board. Teachers will report for work on August 28 and students will report for registration and assignments on August 30.

The Board voted to pay the teachers on the 25th of each month with the possible exception of December and May.

Pupil insurance for 1967-68 was discussed, but no action was taken.

Under authority given in Senate Bill 544 the Board rescinded its action of April 3, 1967 in electing C. C. Walters for a two-year term beginning July

1, 1967 and ending June 30, 1969, and elected said superintendent for a four-year term beginning July 1, 1967, and ending June 30, 1971.

There being no further business at this time, the meeting was adjourned by the chair.

Commander Broughton in making the announcement, stated he hopes that all Perquimans folks will plan now to spend the day here on July 4 and enjoy the parade and stay safe by not planning a trip on the busy highways that usually result from a holiday, from which many never return. The eradication committee has two major responsibilities: First, to encourage all hog producers to vaccinate for hog cholera; second, encourage early reporting of all sick hogs to the local veterinarian, to the county extension office, or to state and federal veterinarians in the area. Early reporting is very important to aid in controlling spread of the disease as well as insuring maximum indemnity.

Federal indemnity is based on one-half the difference between appraised value and net salvage value and \$50.00 for regu, not to exceed \$40.00 for istered swine.

State indemnity is based on one-third the difference between the appraised value and the net salvage value, not to exceed \$12.50 for grade and \$25.00 for registered animals.
