In Storing Corn Use Malathion

Many people are planning on storing corn this fall, to use either for feed or for sale at a later date. To prevent insect problems which generally arise in the spring, a little care and prevention now will pay off real well next spring. "We are suggesting that you put 1 per cent Malathion down along the edge inside your bin and while you are augering corn into the bin, mix 60 lbs. of 1 per cent premium grade Malathion to 1,000 bushels of corn, and spray 1 pint of 57 per cent E C Malathion into 2-5 gallons of water per 1,000 bushels of corn. This material can be mixed with the corn as it

is dumped out of the truck into the auger and this will give you an even spread throughout your grain. This material does not effect the grain for use to livestock or for salable purposes," states Mr. R. M. Thompson, County Extension Chairman, Perquimans County. "Mr. Thompson further states, "We hope that you take care of this problem now, because it is much easier and less expensive to do it at this time than it will be in the spring when the insects become noticeable."
