## Social Security Administration

How can the people of Perquimans County check their Social Security record to see that it includes all of their earnings?

This is important since the amount of the Social Security benefit is based on the credited earnings. It could even mean the difference in being eligible for benefits or not.

The Social Security Administration suggests that all persons interested in checking their account call or write the Social Security Office and ask for Form OAR-7004. It is a simple postcard addressed to the Baltimore Records Office which will furnish a statement of the taxable earnings posted on the worker's account. The OAR-7004 should be sent in every three years. If an error is found, it will be much easier to correct than if detected years after the error occurred.

Remember, earnings under Social Security are important for retirement, in case of disability,

## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO APPLY TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT COMMISSION FOR APPROVAL OF BONDS

NOTICE is hereby given of intention of the undersigned to file application with the Local Government Commission, Raleigh, North Carolina, for its approval of the issuance of the following proposed bonds of the County of Perquimans, North Carolina, which bonds shall be subject to approval of the voters of said County at an election: \$280,000 of bonds to finance the erection and equipment of hospital facilities including clinics and out-patient departments, together with the acquisition of the necessary land or rights-in-land.

The notice was first published on the 5 day of October, 1967. Any citizen or taxpayer objecting to the issuance of all or any of said bonds may file with the Local Government Commission a verified statement setting forth his objections as provided in Section 159-7.1 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, in which event he shall also file a copy of such statement with the undersigned, at any time within ten days from and after such first publication. A copy of this notice must be attached to the statement so filed. Objections set forth in said statement shall be for consideration by said Commission in its determination of whether or not it may hold a public hearing as provided by law on the matter of issuance of said bonds.
