Green Panthers In 32-0 Victory

The Green Panthers of Winfall's Perquimans Union School sprang upon the Panthers of W.S. Creecy High School of Rich Square and clawed them mercilessly by a score of 32-0. Quarterback Joe Winslow scored on a 20-yard run before the game was five minutes old. Minutes later Winslow scored on a 35-yard jaunt to give Perquimans a 12 point lead. Creecy took to the air in a vain attempt to de-claw the irate Panthers who had dropped a 12-6 game to Washington County Union of Roper the week before, which was their second loss in 27 games played dating back to 1964.

Percy Davis defensive half-back intercepted a Creecy pass and ran 40 yards to score standing. Winslow scored his 13th point of the game by bulging over for the extra point.

In the second quarter Winfall moved at will against Rich Square but failed to score and the half ended with Perquimans leading 19-0.

The third quarter saw Perquimans rip Creecy with another score as Percy Davis passed to halfback Chester Jordan for a 30-yard touchdown. Davis ran over for the extra point and Perquimans led 26-0.

The final score of the game came when Davis hit Robert Lee Jones in the end zone with a 20-yard pass. Perquimans is now 3-1-0.

Governor's Wife Set To Christen Research Vessel

RALEIGH—Mrs. Dan Moore, the first lady of North Carolina, will do the honors at Morehead City on Oct. 8 when the State dedicates its new, 85-foot, exploratory fishing vessel, the "Dan Moore".

The dedication ceremonies will be held at the State Port Terminal at Morehead City on the opening day of the fall quarterly meeting of the Board of Conservation and Development.

The "Dan Moore" will have a crew of seven and two marine biologist will be assigned permanently to the craft. The Division of Commercial and Sports Fisheries will operate the vessel which will be based at the division's Camp Glenn facilities at Morehead City.

The research vessel was built by New Bern Shipyards at a cost of \$395,000. An additional \$30,000 was spent for fishing gear, scientific equipment and operational gear. Of this amount, approximately \$15,000 was Federal funds under provisions of the Commercial Fisheries Research and Development Act. The remainder was appropriated by the 1965 General Assembly for construction of the craft. The 1967 General Assembly appropriated \$94,000 for operating funds during the 1967-69 biennium. The vessel is expected to be in full operation in North Carolina coastal waters by latefall. Its primary mission will be to locate commercially valuable stocks of marine fish and develop better means of catching them and bringing them ashore.

The "Dan Moore's" crew is currently composed of Jim Sterling, biologist-project leader; David L. Beveridge, captain; Earl Fulcher, chief mate; Donald Fulcher, chief engineer; and Donald Willis, boatswain. Three additional crew members will be added in the near future.

The Board of Conservation and Development has invited the public to attend the dedication ceremonies for the "Dan Moore" to be held at 3:00 p.m., Sunday, October 8, 1967, at the State Port Terminal in Morehead City.

Big Overcharge By Power Firms

WASHINGTON — Four North Carolina power companies overcharged their customers by \$19.3 million in 1965, the chairman of a consumer research committee has charged in a report here.

Mrs. Sacha Miller, Chairman of the Utility Research Committee of the Consumer Assembly, said in a release that this money was included in a national overcharge total of more than \$618 million by 164 power companies. Mrs. Miller said the Tar Heel firms involved were Duke Power Co., Carolina Power and Light Co., the Nantahala Power and Light Co., and Yadkin, Inc.

The report said Duke overcharged by \$12,241; CP&L by \$6,289,000; Nantahala by \$599,000, and Yadkin by \$387,000. Mrs. Miller said the figures were gathered from the Federal Power Commission's file of reports from the power companies. She said the amount of overcharge was based on income which exceeds six per cent of plant investment. The Consumer Assembly is a federation of labor, trade as-

sociation, community and consumer groups which pool their resources to sponsor national meetings designed to develop ways to protect consumer interests.
