## Sgt. Lightfoot Is Participating In NATO Training

U.S. Air Force Sergeant Sidney D. Lightfoot, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph K. Lightfoot of Star Route, Winfall, N.C., is participating in a massive NATO training exercise in West Germany.

Sergeant Lightfoot, an air freight specialist at Norton AFB, Calif., is supporting Military Airlift Command C-141 Starlifter aircrews transporting more than 2,000 Tactical Air Command personnel and 1,000 tons of cargo from the U.S. to Germany and back.

A total of 74 C-141s are supporting four squadrons of F-4 Phantom tactical fighter squadrons from Holloman AFB, N.M., and Mountain Home AFB, Idaho. Redeployed to the U.S. from Germany in 1968, the fighter-bomber crews are operating from their former home stations at Hahn, Spangdahlem, Bitburg and Ramstein air bases.

The month-long maneuver is the second in a projected series of annual exercises to be conducted as part of the U.S. contribution to increased NATO readiness.

Sergeant Lightfoot is a 1967 graduate of Perquimans County Union High School.

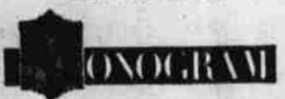
