Those who complete registration forms are sent a checklist of ways in which they may help the retarded.

Miss Wells said, "These community programs must be established in order to provide positive alternatives to residential care and to provide close-to-home programs for retarded and other handicapped people."

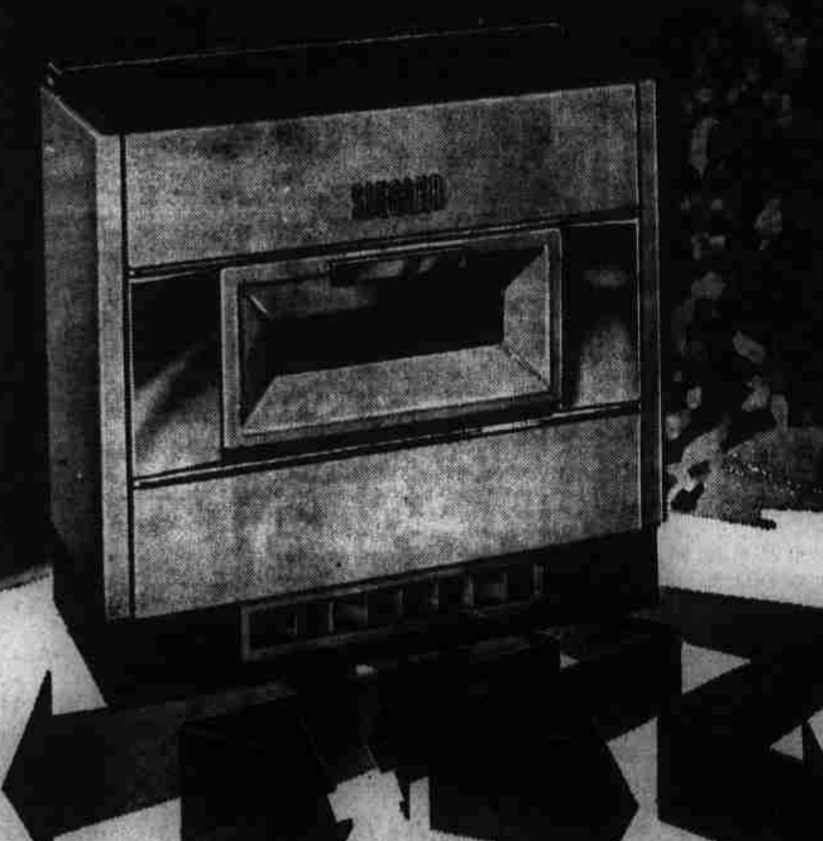
