Everyone who expects to draw a social security retirement benefit must prove they have reached retirement age. A great many of the people who live in the Perquimans area worry about proving their age. They worry and worry but this does not solve their problem. One of the reasons they are worrying is that if they are over 57 years of age and were born in the state of North Carolina, they do not have an original birth certificate. An original birth certificate is the best proof of age that can be furnished but other records can be used. Generally speaking, the next best record is a Federal Census Record made a few years after the person was born.

The personnel in the Social Security Office will assist anyone in completing an application to secure a Federal Census record. All people over 57 years of age who have not discussed their proof-of-age with the social security people, should do so as soon as possible.
