### NOTICE

Reports by persons having custody of tangible personal property of others.-

(a) As of January 1, every person having custody of taxable tangible personal property that has been entrusted to him by another for storage, sale, renting, rany other business purpose shall furnish the appropriate tax supervisor the reports required by subdivisions (a) (1) and (a) (2), below:

- (1) For farm products that are owned by the original producer and that were produced in a county of this State other than that in which the products are situated, there shall be furnished to the tax supervisor of the county in which the products were produced a statement showing the name of the producer, a description of the property, the quantity of the property, and the amount of money, if any, advanced against the products by the person having custody of them.
- (2). For all other tangible personal property, there shall be furnished to the tax supervisor of the county in which the property is situated a statement showing the name of the owner of the property, a description of the property, the quantity of the property, and the amount of money, if any, advanced against the property by the person having custody of it.

Machinery Act of 1971, G. S. 105-308. Duty to list; penalty for failure.

Every person in whose name any property is to be listed under the terms of this sub-apter shall list the property with the tax supervisor or proper list taker within the me allowed by law on an abstract setting forth the information required by this sub-

In addition to all other penalties prescribed by law, any person whose duty it is to list any property who wilfully fails or refuses to list the name within the time prescribed by law shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment not to exceed six months. The failure to list shall be prima facie evidence that the failure was wilful.

Any person who removes or conceals property for the purpose of evading taxation or who side or abets the removal or concealment of property for the purpose of evading taxation shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment not to exceed six months.



LOVE IS ... International Sunday School Lesson for January 2, 1971 LESSON TEXT: Luke 6

The greatest teacher on love that man has ever known for ever will know was Jesus Christ. In this lesson the eloquence of Luke is therefore directed to adding to our understanding of our Lord's teachings on love of our fellowmen, and to encouraging us to express this love towards others in a manner which will be wholly acceptable to God. Perhaps the best commentary on Christ's words is His own exemplary life Concern and forgiveness were the cor-

nerstones of a life devoted exclusively to service to mankind nerstones of a life devoted exclusively to service to mankind. Christ taught that true brotherly love is based on advantages and opportunities unselfishly rendered to others...even at the point of great personal sacrifice on the part of the giver, without thought of personal gains. It cannot, however, be said that such acts will go unrewarded, for God both praises and approves such "acts of the spirit" and His approval is, in itself, the most precious research one unon which penantihy value can be set.

reward ... one upon which no earthly value can be set Definitions of love vary, but Jesus never proclaimed any difference between the love of man for man and the love of man for God. Man was created in God's own image; it therefore follows that how we treat our fellow men will

reflect our treatment of God. In the Sermon on the Mount the chosen twelve were taught basics of true discipleship. They were to practice the perfect expression of love for one another and all their brethren, as

personified in Christ. There was to be no limit to the out personified in Christ. There was to be no limit to the out-pourings of their hearts, as there was no limit to the Father's loving concern for wayward and sinning mankind. The forgiveness which He extended in the Person of His beloved Son should bear the fruit of forgiveness within ourselves towards those who sin against us. And this love and forgiveness should be tendered even though others do not respond to it. This is the test of a true Christian spirit.

The power of love in a world that is fraught with violence must never be under-rated, for in the free expression of Christian love lies the hope of the world. Love is the basic standard for discipleship; as we have received at the hands of our Father, so are we called upon to give. As we follow (or do not follow) that which was preached on the Mount, so do we reveal our relationship to Christ. And as we practice these lenets of our faith, so the world can see Him in us.
