Highlights Of 1972

Tax Changes

J.E. Wall, District Director for the Internal Revenue Service in North Carolina, announced the following highlight changes in federal tax laws as they will affect 1972 returns filed in 1973.

1. The Standard Deduction will increase to 15 per cent of adjusted gross income, limited to \$2000. Low income allowance of \$1300. (The Standard Deduction for 1971 is 13 per cent of adjusted gross income limited to \$1500, and the low-income allowance is \$1050.)

2. Filing requirements for a single person will climb to \$2050 instead of \$1700 for a single person; to \$2800 for a single person over 65 instead of \$2300; to \$2800 for married persons filing jointly, instead of \$2300; to \$3550 for a married couple filing jointly if one is over 65, instead of \$2900; to \$4300 for a couple filing jointly, both over 65, instead of \$3500; and \$750 for married couples filing separately instead of \$600.

3. Child Care Deduction. In 1972 a taxpayer who maintains a household which includes: dependent under 15 (instead of under 13); care of a child under 15 may be claimed by women who are single, divorced, widowed or deserted. The amount for Child Care which can be claimed will rise from a maximum of \$900 to up to \$400 per month for expenses incurred in the household; one dependent, under 15 - up to \$200 per month; for two such dependents up to \$300 per month, or for three or more such dependents, up to \$400 per month.

Child Care deduction in 1972 will be allowed for adjusted gross income up to \$18,000, reduced by 50 cents for each dollar over that amount.

In 1972 expenses for care of a disabled spouse will also be allowed in order for the taxpayer to be employed.

4. Political Contributions: \$1.00 of income tax liability \$2.00 on a joint return) may be designated to go to the fund of a Presidential Election Campaign.

Itemized deductions of up to \$50 (\$100 on a joint return) or a credit for 50 per cent of contributions up to \$12.50 (\$25 for a joint return) will be allowed.
