At a regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Perquimans, North Carolina, held on the First Monday in February, February 7, 1972, at 10:00 o'clock A.M., at its regular meeting place in the Courthouse in Hertford, Perquimans County, North Carolina.

Present Lester H. Simpson, chairman presiding with commissioners, Riley S. Monds, Jr., Thomas D. Nixon, Ellis Winslow, and Guy H. Webb. All commissioners were present.

Reports were received from the Agriculture Extension Service and Social Services Departments.

On motion by Commissioner Monds, and seconded by Commissioner Webb, and duly passed, the Board adopted the following resolution:

Be it Resolved: That a Commission is hereby created which shall be known as the Perquimans County Fire Commission, with general power set forth under the General Statutes, to be composed of six (6) members, one from each Township in the County and one from the Board of County Commissioners, all to be appointed by the Board of County Commissioners, and said Fire Commission members shall serve for a period of one year from the date of this Resolution.

The said Perquimans County Fire Commission shall by the 6th day of March 1972, recommend to the Board of County Commissioners of Perquimans County a plan which said Perquimans County Fire Commission deems advisable for fire protection and fire services in Perquimans County for consideration by the Board of County Commissioners.

AADA Endorses Promotional Magazine

Albemarle Area Development Association (AADA) Thursday night endorsed a proposed regional specialty magazine to promote Eastern North Carolina. Three area development associations, comprising 30 counties, have been asked to contribute \$1,000 each to get a prototype of "The New East" published.

Phil Quitley of Manteo, chairman of AADA's Travel and Recreation Committee, said the committee endorsed

the project and said it is a promotional tool which is greatly needed. He said individual association's, or counties, could not afford the cost of the type quality publication being planned. The magazine will be published quarterly by a private corporation, and without further financial support from the sponsoring associations.

The East Carolina University Regional Development Institute has been actively working on the birth of such a magazine for more than three years. Tom Willis, institute director, has agreed to put the prototype edition together, with the aid of an editorial board from AADA, Coastal Plains and Neuse River associations.

L.F. Amburn, Jr., AADA president, has named Loyal Phillips of Elizabeth City, to represent the association on the board. Phillips is assistant to the president of Dear Publication & Radio, Inc., publishers of The Daily Advance.

Two resolutions were adopted by the board at the meeting held at Holiday Inn. One called on Gates County commissioners to reconsider earlier action requesting to be moved from Region "R" to Region "Q". The other voiced support for the Hertford Water Project.

Rev. Edwin T. Williams of Hertford, executive administrator of the Perquimans County Restoration Association, presented a slide program on "The Restoration and Preservation Industry in Northeastern North Carolina".

Melvin Hearn of Raleigh, a state executive to Coastal Plains Regional Commission, spoke briefly and commended the 10-county area for supporting the regional concept. "It is on this concept that we (Coastal Plains) work," he said.

The Travel and Recreation Committee also agreed to support an "Albemarle Night" during Edenton's 250th anniversary celebration in June. Entertainment will be sought from each county in the area.

Entertainment for the meeting was furnished by the Johnson Swingers of Elizabeth City State University.
