ECU Summer Art Course Being Offered At COA

College of The Albemarle, in cooperation with the Extension Division of East Carolina University, will offer Art 370G—Arts and Crafts, beginning June 26 through July 7, at the COA Technical Center on U.S. 17 North. The class will meet Monday through Friday from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. for the two-week period.

This is a practical workshop type of course giving teachers an opportunity to take part in activities that can be taught to students. It is a course designed for teachers in all grade levels, including teachers of the mentally retarded. This is a three quarter hour senior-graduate course. The course may be used for renewal of "A" and "G" teaching certificates if the course does not duplicate previous credit and if the course is pertinent to the teaching field. All questions pertaining to

the use of credit toward certificate renewal should be directed to your local school unit in-service education coordinator.

The tuition for the class is \$36.00, which does not include the cost of the textbook.
