The Pill

A British Government report, based on a six-year study, says its investigation fails to substantiate U. S. warnings that contraceptive pills might cause cancer in some women.

The report suggests women who take the pill should be watched carefully for signs of breast cancer, noting that numerous benign tumors have been detected in animals used in experiments.

But Britain's chief medical officer told reporters he would have no hesitation in advising his daughter to take the pill.
