# Parents Day Held In Schools

Parents of students in three of the county's schools were able to observe their children during Parents' Day held last week. The open house is part of the ESEA Title I program plan for the year.

The event allowed parents to visit the special reading classes or the tutorial program to observe their children. Each parent had an opportunity to see his child using some of the equipment and materials used in the special reading instruction or observed his child being tutored, depending on the program their child was involved in.

Officials cited one of the probable reasons for the excellent response to Parents' Day was the fact that transportation was provided for those parents in need of it by Dewey Newby, home-school coordinator for the county school system.

The purpose of the "open house" was three-fold; First, it gave parents an opportunity to meet their child's teacher or tutor. Second, it allowed parents to see their children receiving special instruction in the classroom. And third, it was pointed out what could be done in the home to en-

courage children to read outside the classroom and to develop a love for reading.

The informal observation day was held last Tuesday at Hertford Grammar School, Wednesday at Perquimans Union School and Thursday at Perquimans Central Grammar.

Parents' Day not only involved by parents, but also members of the Title I advisory committee, board of education members and members of their advisory committee, and school administrators.

The airman, a 1971 graduate of Perquimans High School Hertford, N.C., attended Delaware State College.



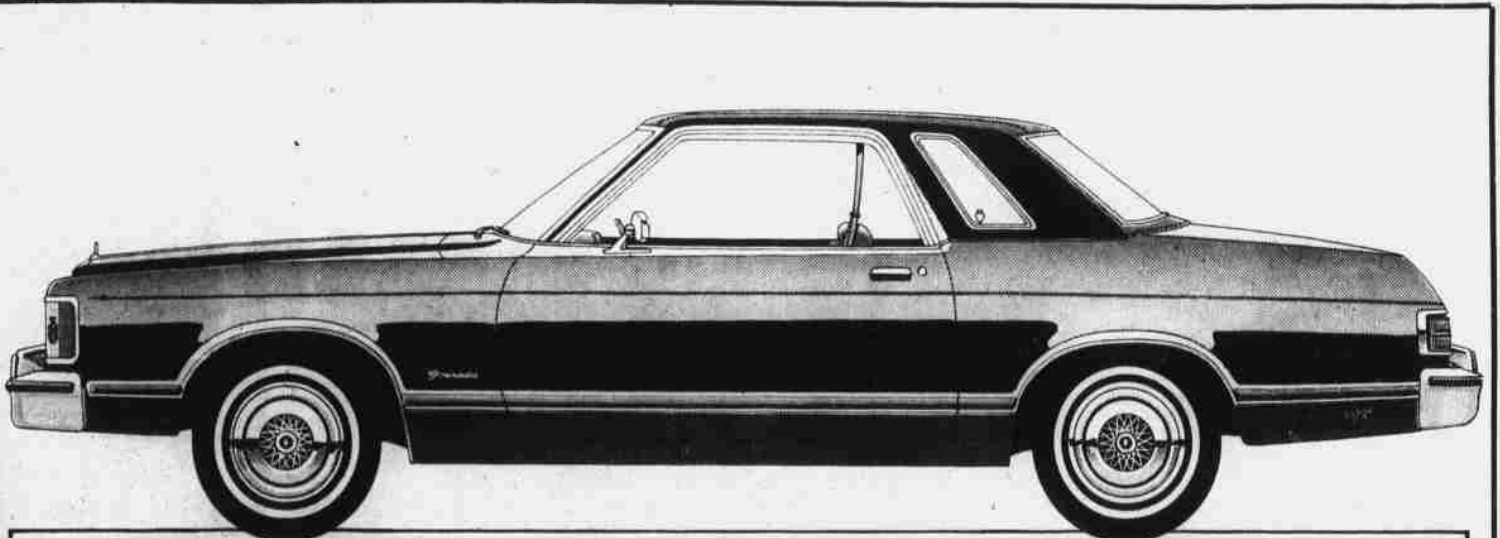
