IS IT RIPE?

You can tell if a cantaloupe is ripe by looking at the stem attachment. If it is separated completely, the melon was full ripe when picked. If more than a half of the stem section remains on the fruit, the

melon was picked prematurely, according to N.C. State University extension horticulturists. Commercial cantaloupes are picked at half-slip, usually, and will have half the stem attached.

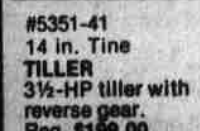
