**DECALS**—Linda Liggings of the N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission Division of Motorboats and Water Safety poses with the validation decals to be displayed on motorboats during 1976. Boat owners have the option of registering their vessels for a one-year or three-year period. Boats numbered for one year will display a red "76" decal, while boats numbered for a three-year period will display an orange "78" decal. A recent state law requires all motorboats to be numbered.

## Decals For Motor Boats

Beginning January 1, 1976 all motorboats operating on public waters of North Carolina are required to be numbered. Previously boats powered by motors of ten (10) horsepower or less were not required to be numbered. Documented vessels and boats whose only source of mechanical propulsion is an electric motor remain exempt from the numbering requirements.

In addition to the requirement for displaying the number on both sides of the bow, a validation decal, indicating the expiration date of the certificate of number, shall be displayed on the starboard bow immediately following the number. The validation decal will be supplied to the boat owner when the boat is registered.

The cost for numbering a motorboat is three dollars (\$3) annually or seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50) for a three-year registration. Space is provided on the boat number application and renewal forms for an individual to select whether he wishes to number his boat for a one-year or a three-year period.

The Carolina Hardware Company is going out of business and is advertising its stock at greatly reduced prices in a double page advertisement in this issue of The Perquimans Weekly. H.C. O'Neal, the owner, who purchased the business in 1935, has announced that his plans are such that it is necessary for him to convert his stock into cash at the earliest possible date, and that it is for this reason that he is making such a drastic cut in prices. Mr. O'Neal expects to close out the entire stock of goods, as well as the fixtures, within the next ten days.

**NO CAUSE FOR ALARM:** Phyllis Haskett, the little daughter of Mr. and Mrs. N.C. Haskett, of Durants Neck, is recovering from an attack of scarlet fever at the home of her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. P.L. Stephens, in Hertford. There have been three other cases of scarlet fever in the county during the past two months, but there is no cause for alarm, according to Dr. T.P. Brinn, County Health Officer, who says that this is only a normal incidence.

**COTTON GINNING STILL AHEAD OF LAST YEAR:** Willie M. Harrell, a special agent for the Bureau of Census, Department of Commerce, reports that there were 4,554 bales of cotton ginned in Perquimans County from the crop of 1937 prior to December 1 as compared with 4,056 bales ginned to December 1 of the 1936 crop.

## Holiday Traffic Death Prediction

CHARLOTTE—The N.C. State Motor Club has estimated that approximately 32 persons will die in North Carolina traffic accidents during the Christmas and New Year's holidays.

That prediction came today from Thomas B. Watkins, chairman of the statewide organization.

"But there is a bright spot," Watkins noted. "Through eleven months of 1975, fatalities are the lowest in ten years. That gives us encouragement that drivers are becoming more alert and safety minded."

Through November, the North Carolina death toll stands at 1334. A year ago at that time, 1446 persons had been killed.

The state will count its fatalities during two 102-hour periods beginning at 6 p.m. on the eve of each holiday and lasting until midnight on the Sunday afterwards. Last year, 15 persons lost their lives during two 30-hour holiday periods.
