

Gives Demonstration

"How to Make Eggplant Fritters" was the title of the demonstration given to the Extension Homemakers Club women Monday, July 18 by Mrs. M.B. Taylor, Home Economics Extension Agent.

To make the fritters, Mrs. Taylor used:
 2 T. flour
 1 egg, beaten
 3 c. cooked eggplant, mashed
 1/4 t. salt
 1/4 t. pepper
 dash of cayenne and fat
 To prepare, she stirred the flour and egg into the eggplant, then beat the mix-

ture until light; seasoned, dropped into hot, deep fat by tablespoons; and fried until brown.
 Each member sampled the eggplant fritters. None of the members expressed a liking for eggplant prior to sampling the recipe prepared by Mrs. Taylor. The members were then inspired and accepted a copy of the recipe. They plan to make and serve the eggplant fritters to their family.

In addition to the recipe demonstration, the meeting included old and new business. Under the topic of old business, it was pointed out that the club had sponsored a successful baby contest. During the new business, the group made plans to participate in the county "Day of Fun" to be held during August.

Belated birthday wishes are extended to Linda Long who celebrated her birthday last week.



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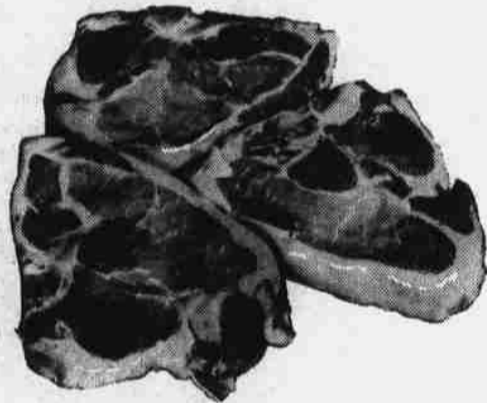
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
