



to affect state GREENSBORO -

Federal tax law revisions passed in 1977 will affect most North Carolinians, the Internal Revenue Sarvice savs.

The old standard deduction has been replaced by the "zero bracket amount" and will be used by approximately 1.1 million taxpayers in the Tar Heel State. The maximum has been increased to \$2,200 for single persons, \$3,200 for married filing jointly and \$1,600 each for marrieds filing separately.

The new tax tables may be used by most North Carolina taxpayers. These tax tables now include personal exemptions, the "zero

If you die without accepting Christ as your personal savior all is lost.


