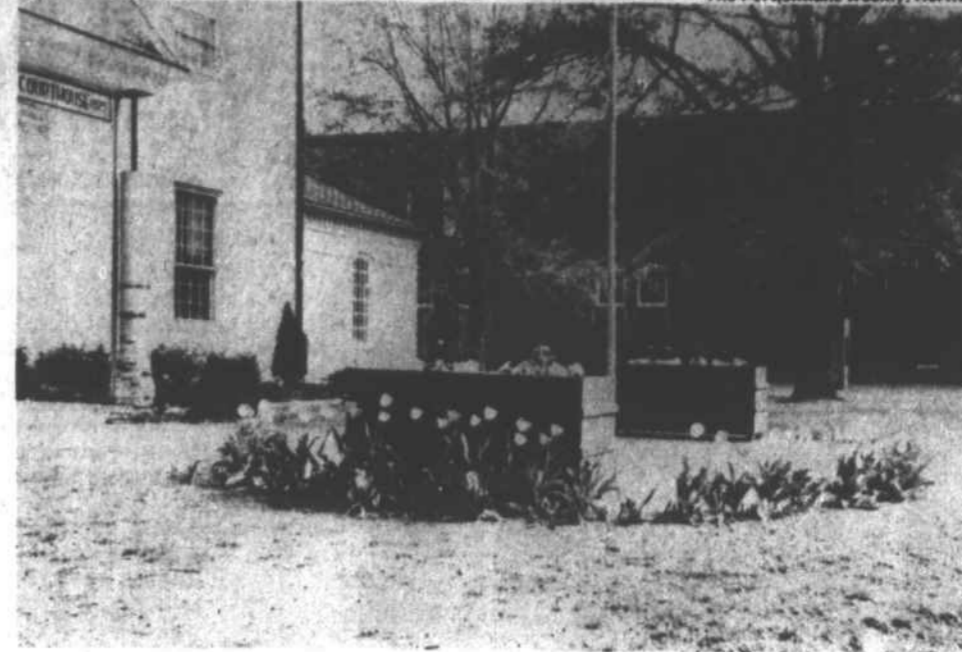

And finally, a sure sign of

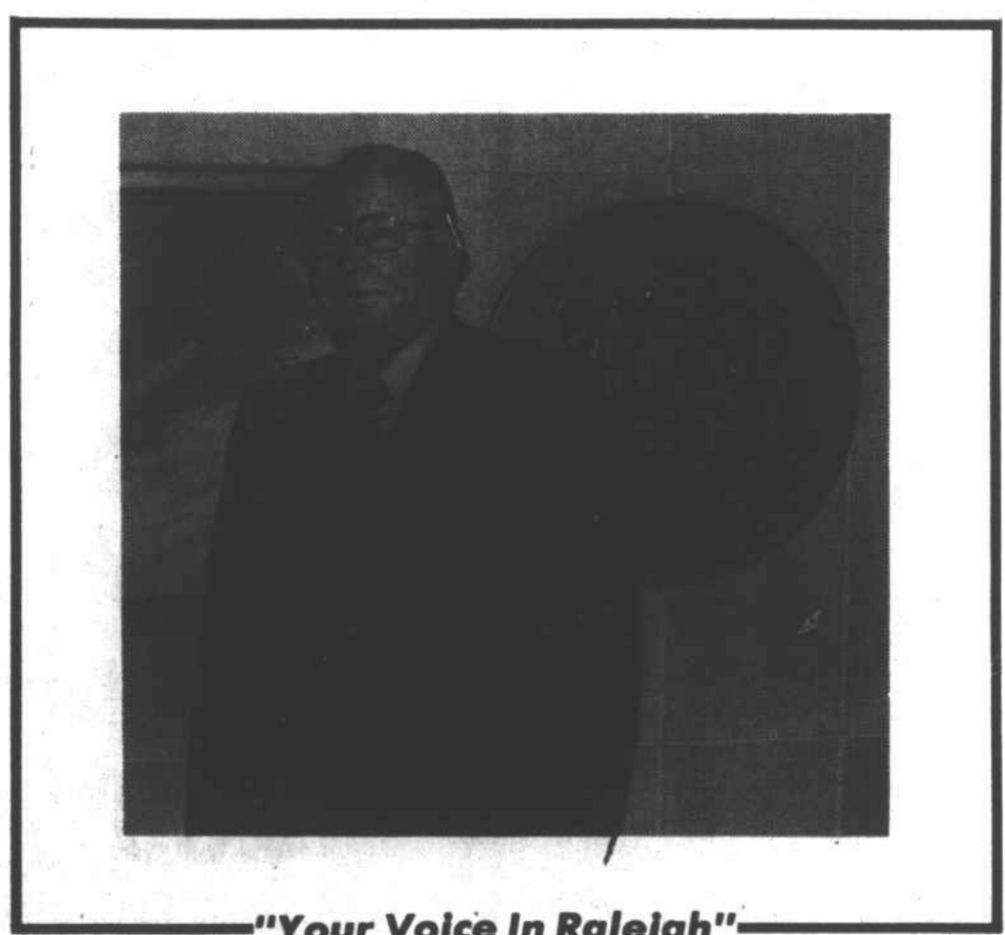
spring is when newspaper reporters try to fulfill their longing to be outdoors by writing articles about the signs of Spring.
