PORTSMOUTH, VA. - The Coast Guard is considering changing the regulations governing the operation of the U.S. 17 drawbridge across the Perquimans River to allow periods when the draw will not open for the passage of vessels.

If the proposal is accepted the draw will open on signal, except from midnight to 8 a.m. from April 1 through September 30, and from 10 p.m. to 10 a.m. from October 1 through March 31.
