Agriculture news

"Farm equipment thefts are continuing to rise in the United States and North Carolina. Counties near state boarders theft", states Richard H. Bryant, County Extension Chairman.

An effort to recover stolen farm equipment is being made by the FBI, the N.C. Sheriff's Association, N.C. Crime Prevention, Officers Organization, N.C. Agricultural Extension Service, Farm Equipment Dealers Association, N.C. Farm Bureau Federation, Inc. and the Perquimans County Farm Bureau.

As you know it is difficlut to recover stolen farm equipment, mainly because there are few, if any, identifying marks. The county will attempt to identify each piece of farm equipment you have on the farm.

"To participate in this identification program, you should contact Sheriff Broughton to get your number and then contact the local Farm Bureau Office to borrow the necessary dyes with which to number your equipment. The Farm Bureau Office will supply you with a booklet to keep your farm equipment numbers in. It also contains information on where to put the identifying numbers that are assigned to you", further explains Byrant.

"After you have numbered your equipment and a piece of it is stolen, all you have to do is report this number to the sheriff and it goes on a nationwide list of stolen property, making it easily identified as your property. As things get slack for you during the winter, this may be a good way to spend a day protecting your valuable farm equipment.'
