**ELIZABETH CITY** — A man whose car rammmed head-on into another vehicle on U. S. Highway 17 about eight miles north of Elizabeth City on Monday, January 9, killing a passenger in that car, was charged Friday with manslaughter.

Trooper C. H. Mims of the N. C. Highway Patrol arrested Kenneth Purnell Floyd, 33, of 1403 Herrington Road about 3 p.m. Friday.

Floyd has been released on \$2,000

bond. Killed in the crash was Marie Rountree, 53, of Perquimans County. Five other local residents who were in the car with her were also injured.

The incident occurred when Floyd, driving a 1981 Cadillac south on U. S. 17 near Jones Lumber Company, attempted to pass two other southbound vehicles and plowed head-on into a 1980 Mercury driven by John Thomas Stallings of Belvidere.
