Try muffins for a tasty summer treat

Enjoy two muffin recipes this week. Both are made from nutritous ingredients.

POPPY SEED MUFFINS % C. sugar

14 C. soft butter 1/2 t. grated orange peel 2 C. flour 21/2 t. baking powder 1/2 t. salt

¼ t. nutmeg

1 C. milk

1/2 C. golden raisins 1/2 C. chopped pecans ¼ C. poppy seeds

Cream sugar, butter and orange peel until light and fluffy. Add eggs one at a time beating

well after each. Sift dry ingredients together and add to creamed mixture alternately with milk, blending well after each addition. Stir in raisins, nuts and poppy seeds. Fill paper lined muffin cups % cups full. Bake 400 degrees, 20 minutes yield 16.

BANANA ORANGE BRAN MUFFINS

1 C. orange juice

3 C. unprocessed bron 2 t. grated orange rind

2 eggs 3 ripe bananas, mashed 1 C. plain yogurt 2 C. whole wheat flour 1/2 C. corn meal 21/2 t. baking soda

Preheat oven 375 degrees. Heat orange juice until simmering. Mix with bron and orange rind and let stand. Beat eggs, add banana, honey and yogurt. Beat

Mix with bron. Sift together the flour and soda and fold into the bron mixture. Bake in greased muffin tin 375 degrees for 20 minutes. Yield 24.

Industry standards that allow
you to compare your business
with others across the nation can
be of great assistance to the business manager. They are available from several sources including your own trade

One such standard is "inven-One such standard is "inventory turns," determined by dividing the cost of sales for the year by the "average inventory" carried during the year. It's often less accurately determined by dividing the yearly gross sales by year-end inventory. If your business's industry standard for inventory turns is four times per year and you are turning inventory only three times, you should review your inventory to see review your inventory to see what stock is not moving and what promotional efforts you undertake to improve sales. "Inventory turns" significantly below your industry standard indicate that you have too much money invested in inventory in relation to the sales you are producing.
Other commonly used standards include:

 Gross profit percentages
 Current ratio (Current assets divided by current liabilities).

Accounts receive turnover (Net sales divided

by average trade receivables). 4. Profit margin on sales (Net income divided by net sales). Rate of return on assets

(Net income divided by total average assets.)


