The Perquimans County **Department** of Social Services will be receiving cheese, butter, corn meal, milk, honey and rice in December for distritution to low income families in our county.

Each family will be required to sign a "Declaration of Income Application" as well as a distribution log showing receipt of the various foods received.

As has been the case in the past, this distribution must be on a first come, first serve basis.

Food stamp recepients will be automatically eligible and will be mailed an application which they must bring to the Ice Plant in order to receive the donated USDA foods.
