Quiz Bowl teams advance

Nine High schools teams will compete in the state Quiz Bowl finals slated for Saturday, April 12 at 1 p.m. in the auditorium of the Archives-State Library building in Raleigh.

The nine finalists who have already competed at the local, district and regional levels are: Tuscola High School in Waynesville; Freedom High School in Morganton; Salisbury High School; Richard Senior High School in Rockingham; Sander-son High School in Raleigh; D.H. Conley High School in Greenville, sponsored by the Sheppard Memorial Library; New Hano-ver High School in Wilmington; and North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics in Durham.

The Quiz Bowl began in 1978 as an academic competition among teams of high school students in 12 eastern North Carolina coun-

ties. Under the sponsorship of public libraries, the program expanded to a statewide contest in 1979. By 1985, the Quiz Bowl had grown to include more than 70 counties.

The program gives academically-oriented students the chance to compete and shine in a spotlight normally reserved for athletes. The Quiz Bowl encourages learning and education and provides public libraries with an exciting program involving young adults.

The University of North Carolina Center for Public Television will tape highlight of the state finals for broadcast over their network on Sunday, April 20, from 3 to 4 p.m.

The Quiz Bowl is co-sponsored by public libraries and by the Division of State Library Services Construction Act, Title I.

stroke and ways to overcome handicaps generated by stroke; and to give hope and encouragement to new stroke patients.

The most valuable support given to members of the Stroke Club comes from other members. Almost any stroke-related problems that may arise will have already been faced and dealt with by one or more members of the group. The support a recent stroke victim receives in hearing from another stroke patient who has coped with a similar problem may have a greater impact than the advice of a physician or therapist. Only another stroke victim can fully understand the obstacles a stroke patient must overcome.

The same can be said of spouses and families of the stroke victim. A Stroke Club can provide support to a family, and the knowledge that they are not unique in facing stroke-related problems. Other families have overcome these same obstacles and can offer specific advice.

The Easter Seal Society sponsors Stroke Clubs in 23 counties throughout North Carolina. The Pasquotank County Stroke Club

will hold its first meeting on Monday, April 7, 1986 at 7:30 p.m. at the Agriculture Building on McPherson Street in Elizabeth City.

Any person who has had a stroke is eligible to join; and family members and friends are also encouraged to attend meetings.

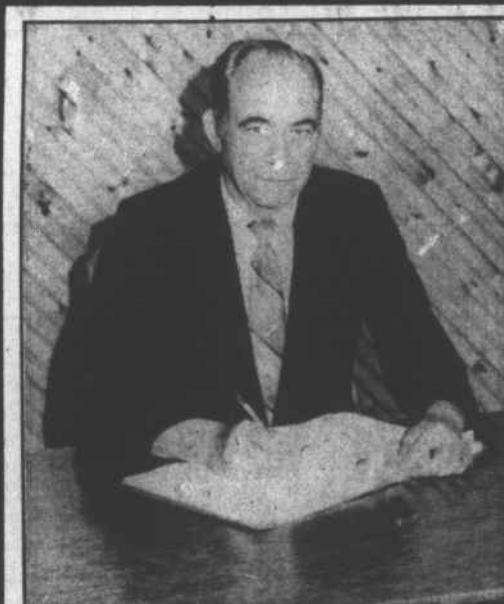
