"News from Next Door" Church outreach effort planned

A Perquimans County Wesleyan church, Elizabeth City-based River City Development and a Baptist group are teaming up this year for the annual "Love PQ Week."

From July 27 through July 31, volunteers will be working in Perquimans County to make small household repairs, clean up debris and to "love on the community."

Bagley Swamp Wesleyan started the effort in 2013. Pastor James Spaugh said the group has been tweaking the effort with each passing year. Partnering with River City Development this year brings financial expertise with dealing with government dollars. The group is also working with the N.C. Baptist Men, a group that has more experience in more complicated construction projects.

"We're a church and we're not used to handling outside donations from government, and we wanted to make sure the dollars were spent in the right way," Spaugh said about the cooperation with River City.

Spaugh said church members had planned to work with River City on projects in the Pasquotank County this year, but the event happened while students at the church were attending camp.
