### Nelson named new chair

The Perquimans County Commission has a new chairman.

Every year, during the first meeting in December, the board votes on officers for the coming year.

On Dec. 4 Commissioner Kyle Jones, who was chairman, nominated Wallace Nelson to serve in 2018. The vote was unanimous in favor with one member, Ed Muzzulin, absent.

Fondella Leigh, who served as vice chair for the past year, will remain in that post by unanimous vote.

"When I became chairman, I told them I'd only do it for a year," Jones said. "It was a privilege to nominate Wallace. I've known him since I was 15, and we're fortunate to have him and Fondella leading us."

Sheriff talks about church safety

Church members looking for a single solution to secure their sanctuary, they found out there may not be one.

Sheriff Shelby White presented a program last week to a group of about 100 people at Perquimans County High School.

The meeting was prompted in part because of a shooting in Texas in November that left 26 people dead and 20 people injured.

There was another one in 2015 in South Carolina that left nine people dead.

The circumstances of both of those were different. In the South Carolina case, the shooter came and worshipped with members of the 201year-old Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church before he pulled a gun and shot church members.

In the Texas case, the gunman burst in on a service already in progress and killed his victims.

White said he scheduled the meeting in hopes he can help churches that are thinking about security.

before Jones was Janice Cole. She held the post for a number of years before she decided not to run again.

Jones reflected on the past year.

"Our accomplishments are built on the good decision-making of prior boards of this county. So I'm conscious of the fact that our decision-making will influence future boards, which is a big part of the reason why I'm so adamant about keeping spending low.

"When I campaigned in 2016. I made it clear that our older-adult and senior population were priorities for me, and I think our budget reflected that. "I think it went well," White said of the meeting in the PCHS auditorium. He said some of those who attended were from Camden and Pasquotank counties. That might because Pasquotank County didn't hold a similar meeting until Dec. 12.

"I have an open invitation to people if they wanted me to come and take a look at their church for ideas," White said.
