An honor student, Bonita was recently selected to Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities. She has been the recipient of several major scholarship awards from community organizations based on musical talents and scholarship. She serves as president of the college's chapter of the Music Education National Association and is a member of the college choirs and the band. She attended North-east Senior High School in Guilford County.

Bonita anticipates doing graduate study in Music at the University of Florida or University of Iowa. This summer she will be performing at Nashville's Opryland with other talented youth from across the country.
