Newbold Laboratory School At FSU Comes Down

FAYETTEVILLE — One landmark building on the Fayetteville State University campus is being demolished because of safety measures. The Newbold Training School was completed in 1930 with sixteen classrooms, six labora-

ary practice teaching rooms, library, auditorium-gymnasium, and a cafeteria. It was the culmination of long and patient efforts of Mr. N. C. Newbold and Dr. E. E. Smith to obtain the school whereby students majoring in Element-

ary Education would have a laboratory school to apply the theories and concepts gained through their college courses. The school was named for Mr. N. C. Newbold, State Director of Negro Education. Funds were received from several sources to support the school: The Rosenwald Fund, General Education Board of North Carolina, State Appropriations, City of Fayetteville, Federal Grants, and community contributions.

Bennett Institutes Home And Family Life Center

GREENSBORO — Bennett College will establish a Home and Family Life Center to provide experience which may be utilized in establishing and maintaining strong family units. The Center is being funded under the Advanced Institutional Development Program.

Center will be involved in publishing material in the area of Family Life and the Home for the use of educating further students and people seeking information for advanced study.

Receives WSSU Scholarship

"We are very excited about this project because of what it can mean to the improvement of the black family unit," explained Dr. Isaac H. Miller, president of the women's college.

"A great percentage of families in this country are headed by women, especially in the case of black families." He cited statistics gathered from the Census Bureau in 1973 which concluded that of 6.6 million families headed by females, 35% of these are headed by black women.

"As a women's liberal arts college with a historically black clientele, Bennett must address itself to the mission of providing a sound education for women who will be able to maintain stronger family units, as well as to equip women who will prefer a single's life."

The Home and Family Life Center will sponsor a series of mini-courses in the areas of child-care, consumer economics, family organization and structure, nutrition for health, housing selection, care and upkeep of the home, basic clothing for family members, and other specialized areas.

Seminars and institutes will be held under the guidance of family-oriented consultants for students and the general community.
