## Punishment Must Always Be Immediate

Now and then, I have, in this column, entreated parents to try to limit punishment of the child under four or five to the few things he must never do, and to try to make pleasant the many other things he may do and must do. I have even urged that we aim to avoid positive commands (making positive suggestions instead) to this young child, excepting in routines (where we think of the necessary command as mere information).

I have advised, except for these routines, that we merely request the child when we wish him to do something he has not been accustomed to do regularly, and to let him choose then as if he were an adult, whether to accede to the request or not. Indeed, this principle can be made to work with the older child of any age by winning co-operation.

On the other hand, when you tell the tot "No" or "Don't," punish him at once if he does not obey promptly; and be sure the punishment is effective.

As for routines in the child under four, or five, punishment is rarely, if ever, necessary or desirable. If this tot refuses to go to bed, in spite of your best persuasive powers, just pick him up and take him there. Don't punish him to make him go. In case you have up to then answered all his questions kindly, read much to him, enjoyed his creations however crude, you might be able while carrying this resisting type to bed to turn his attention to some interest that would melt his resistance into happy co-operation. Some parents actually can do this.

### Age For Punishment.

From about six to 12, the average child is old enough to profit from punishment.

Say your child is 10. Tell him just once in the morning or afternoon, that from now on till the end of the school year, or even till he is 14, he shall make a bee-line to the house, if out of doors, when the lights appear. If he fails to obey this rule just once, tell him exactly what the penalty will always be after each offense. Then keep your word.

An effective penalty might reasonably be for him to sit in a chair doing nothing—no radio, no fannies, no books—for exactly one hour where you can see him. If dinner is being served, let him serve his sentence by

## A. and T. To Start Training Infantry Officers for Army

Greensboro. — Beginning in September, A. and T. College, which has been teaching military science and tactics for 25 years, will start training officers for infantry units in a program which includes four years of intensive military training. The establishment of the reserve officers training corps at A. and T. College comes as the result of the efforts of Pres F. D. Bluford, the board of trustees of the college, congressmen, senators and leading citizens of the state.

A. and T. has, for many years, received high ratings in its military under Capt. Robert Lee Campbell, science department. The present unit D. S. C., includes 400 men. Only two years of military science is required of all students. The college band, which has been operating under separate direction, will be under the direct command of the unit.

The establishment of the unit at A. and T. will enable the institution, which, for a long time has offered defense training courses, to render a greater service in the national defense program.

Announcement that A. and T. had been selected for a senior R. O. T. C. unit was in Washington on Thursday, April 30. Three other colleges also were designated for such units, these being West Virginia State College, Institute, W. Va., field artillery; Hampton Institute, Hampton, Va., coast artillery; and Prairie View State Normal and Industrial College, Texas, infantry.

### Today's Menu.

Liver and Bacon en Brochet  
Baked Potatoes.  
Lettuce or Cabbage Salad  
Prune Bars Coffee or Tea  
Liver and Bacon en Brochet  
1 to 2 lbs. lamb or calves' liver,  
Sliced bacon  
1 No. 2 can kernel corn  
6 or 8 carrots, parboiled.  
Cut liver in inch-and-a-half squares and put on metal skewers, alternating with squares of bacon. Sprinkle with salt and pepper, brush with melted fat—butter or margarine. Drain corn and put in broiler pan, season with salt and pepper. Parboil carrots, season and roll in melted butter and place on broiler rack with liver and bacon. Broil under moderate heat from 10 to 12 minutes, turning to cook liver and bacon evenly.

### Prune Bars.

1/2 c. flour  
1 tsp. cinnamon  
6 tsp. baking powder.  
1 c. oatmeal  
1/2 c. shortening  
1-4 c. milk  
3-4 c. brown sugar  
1 egg  
1 lge. c. cooked, dried prunes  
1/4 c. walnut meats.  
1-4 c. prune juice  
Sift flour, measure, and stir with baking powder and cinnamon, then stir in oatmeal. Cream shortening, add sugar gradually, beating well, then add beaten egg. Add dry ingredients alternately with prune juice and milk; add prunes cut in pieces and walnut meats. Pour or spread in a square tin and bake about 30 minutes in moderate oven (350 degrees F.). Cool, cut in squares and sprinkle with powdered sugar.

In cleaning a rug, whether with a broom, carpet sweeper or vacuum cleaner, move it across the rug crosswise. This method of cleaning prevents strain on the warp threads that help hold the rug together.
