

Punishment Must Always Be Immediate

By GARRY C. MYERS, Ph.D. Now and then, I have, in this column, entreated parents to try to limit punishment, of the child under four or five, to the few things he must never do, and to try to make pleasant the many other, things he may do and must do. I have even urged that we aim to avoid positive suggestions instead) to this young child, excepting in routines (where we think of the necessary command as mere information).

I have advised, except for these routines, that we merely request the child when we wish him to do something he has not been accustomed to do regularly, and to let him choose then as if he were an adult, whether to accede to the request or not. Indeed, this principle can be made to work with the older child of any age by winning co-operation.

On the other hand, when you tell the tot "No" or "Don't," punish him at once if he does not obey promptly; and be sure the punishment is is effective.

As for routines in the child under four, or fivé, punishment is rarely, if ever, necessary or desirable if this tot refuses to go to bed, in spite of your best persuasive powers, just plck him up and take him there. Don't pupish him to make him go. In case you have up to then answered all his questions kindly, read much to him, enjoyed his creations however crude, you might be able while carrying this resisting type to bed to turn his attention to some interest that would malt his resistance hat happy cooperation. Some parents actually can do this.

From about six to 12, the average child is old enough to profit from punishment.

Say your child is 10. Tell him just once in the moring or afternoon, that from now on till the end of the school year, or even till he is 14, he shall make a beeline to the house, if out of doors, when the lights appear. If he fails to only this rule just once, tell him exactly what the penalty will always be after set offense. Then keep your word.

Here Is Where A. and T. Makes Fine Machinists

Greensboro. — Beginning in September, A. and T. College, which has been teaching military science and factics for 25 years, will start training officers for infantry units in a program which includes four years of Intensive military training. The establishment of the reserve officers training corps at A. and T. College comes as the result of the efforts of Pres F. D. Buldord, the board of trustees of the college, congressmen, senators and leading citzens of the state.

A and T. has, for many years, received high ratings in its military under Capt. Robert Lee Campbell, science department. The present unit D. S. C., includes 400 men. Only two years of military science is required of all students. The college band, which has been operating under separate direction, will be under the direct command of the unit.

The establishment of the unit at A. and T. will enable the institution, which, for a long time has offered defense training courses, to render a greater service in the national defense program.

Announcement that A and T had been selected for a senior R. O. T. C. unit was r 'n Washington on Thursday, April 30. Three other colleges also were designated for such units, these being Weat Virginia State College, Institute, W. Va, field artillery; Hampton Institute, Hampton, Va., coast artillery; and Prarie View State Normal and Industrial College, Texas, infantry.


