DIRTY AIR RUINS TRACTOR ENGINES

The farmer who devotes a little more time to his tractor during hot, dusty days will prolong the life of the engine and get better economy.

A tractor engine takes in about 9,000 gallons of air for every gallon of fuel it burns, according to John Glover, extension specialist in biological and agricultural engineering at North Carolina State University.

A tractor pulling a combine through a grain field will burn about three gallons of gasoline or fuel oil every hour. This means, Glover points out, that for every 10 hours of operation the tractor engine takes in over one-quarter million gallons of air.

"That's a lot of air, and it may include a lot of dirt, especially under dusty conditions," the specialist remarks. "Under extreme conditions, dirt could ruin an engine in less than a day's work."

Proper care of the air cleaner results in better economy and insures longer engine life, Glover explains. An efficient air cleaner removes the dirt and dust particles that grind away engine parts such as cylinders, rings and bearings.

Generally, about every 10 hours of engine operation, the air cleaner cup should be removed, and the old oil should be discarded. Scrape the dirt from the bottom of the cup, wash in kerosene and refill the cup to the mark with clean oil, Glover suggests.

Some newer tractors have dry paper filters in series with a cyclone-type pre-cleaner. The specialist says they function much like the air filters on automobiles. "These filters can be

Home on the Range



Since chicken appears on many family menus at least once a week, homemakers are always anxious to know of new ways to prepare it. CHICKEN 'N GRAVY, TEXAS STYLE

(Makes 6 to 8 servings)

| 3 to 3½ pounds frying chicken pieces | 1 can (10½ ounces) condensed cream of celery soup |
| ¼ cup flour | 1 cup grated process cheese |
| ¼ cup melted butter | ¾ teaspoon salt |
| 1 can (12 ounces) Mexican-style corn, drained | ½ teaspoon pepper |
| ½ cup (small can) Carnation evaporated milk | Dash paprika |

Coat chicken with flour. Arrange chicken in single layer skin side down in melted butter in baking dish (7½ x 12 x 2-inches). Bake uncovered in 425° (hot) oven for 30 minutes. Turn chicken, bake until brown 15 to 20 minutes longer or until tender. Remove from oven; reduce oven temperature to 325° F. Pour off excess fat. Add corn. Combine evaporated milk, soup, cheese, salt and pepper; pour over chicken and corn. Sprinkle with paprika. Cover dish with foil. Return to oven; continue baking for 15 to 20 minutes.

blown out a couple of times with an air hose, but be careful not to puncture them," he cautions.

Make sure the cyclone-type pre-cleaner on paper air filters stays clean to prevent the paper element from becoming clogged too quickly, Glover adds. "If the air pre-cleaner doesn't work automatically, check it and dump the trash daily." A clogged air cleaner will choke the engine.

The specialist suggests following the instructions in the operator's manual for detailed procedures for particular tractors.

BEDDING PLANT FIELD DAY SET AT RALEIGH
