for the new Republic of Nigeria.

He also conducted a special study at the University of London and the International Food and Agriculture Organization in Rome to look into the types of community development support available to African countries.

Mr. Wynn has written various articles on dairy farming and has received a number of awards and citations, including a twenty-year service award from the United States Department of Agriculture for service rendered in dairy extension in North Carolina.

He is a member of the American Dairy Science Association, the American Society for Animal Production, the North Carolina Bureau Federation, and the North Carolina 4-H Foundation.

In addition to his involvement in professional organizations, Mr. Wynn is also active in a variety of civic and community organizations. He works with the YMCA, PTA, and youth and church groups. He is currently serving on the Board of Deacons of the Providence Baptist Church in Greensboro.

Mr. Wynn is married to the former Margaret Howerton of South Boston, Va. The Wynns have four children: Mrs. Margaret Dancy, Helena, Elizabeth, and R. L. (Bobby) Wynn II.
