There are no costly and towering monuments, instead the rich and poor alike has a single small slab to mark his resting place. The slabs are placed in a horizontal position. This is an old burying place some of the graves dating from the 18th century. Rev. Schenk then took us through the Moravian Church which is very elegant and impressive, and on our return to the hotel we saw Salem Female Academy. As we still had some time, we went to see the Lutheran Church of which Rev. Schenk is pastor.
