C. W. Ogverman, farm agent of the State College Extension Service, said this Manns Harbor farmer became interested in the poultry business after attending an Extension poultry school in his community.

Farm Questions Answered

Q.—How can I rid my house of small insects that destroy wall paper and bound books?

A.—This insect is, in all probability, the silver-fish as this so-called fire brat is partial to any material carrying a high starch or sugar content. They are especially fond of the sizing in wall paper, book bindings, and starched clothing and curtains.

A poisoned bait containing one part of the insecticide to three parts of oatmeal, ground to flour, one-quarter teaspoonful of white arsenic and a like amount of salt together with one-half teaspoonful of sugar is the best control. Mix ingredients dry and then moisten so as to bind the substances together. A teaspoonful placed in shallow cardboard boxes in several places in the home will gradually eliminate the pest.

Q.—When should young birds be vaccinated for ptx or sorehead?

A.—Young birds are more susceptible to this trouble than adults and the best time to vaccinate is when the birds are from 10 to 15 weeks old. At this time, the chicken pox virus (not ptx) should be used. Pull a few feathers from the thigh and rub the small brush, which comes with the vaccinating material, over the holes. When vaccinating is once started, all birds on the place should be treated as the vaccinating material is alive and might find its way to the face parts of unvaccinated birds and thus spread the disease.

Q.—What is the best control for

the black spot disease in my rose garden?

A.—Since the organism that causes this disease makes most of its development within the leaves it is necessary the leaves be kept coated with a fungicide at all times. Dust the leaves with a fine grade of dusting sulphur or spray with a 4-4-50 Bordeaux mixture when the leaves first open and continue the applications as often as is necessary to keep them covered. Pick off all dead leaves and trim and burn them.

This same treatment will control the powdery mildew so common on roses.

Resistant Strains Check Wilt Growth

Okton wilt parasites found in 150,000 acres of No. 1 Carolina farm land cause growers an annual loss of 30,000 to 50,000 bales, said Dr. Luther Shaw, extension plant pathologist at State College.

There are several strains of w-resistant cotton, he added, and growers whose land is infested with this parasite should elect one of these strains.

Clewilt and Dixie Triumph are two of the best wilt resistant varieties for North Carolina. But be sure you get you seed from a reliable breeder or dealer, or from a farmer who has his seed certified, Dr. Shaw stressed.

Fertilizing the plants with an adequate amount of potash will also help cotton withstand the wilt attacks.

Offer Scholarships For Best Livestock

Three one-year scholarships to State College which will be offered North Carolina 4-H club members again this year have been announced by L. R. Harrill, 4-H club leader at the college.

One will go to the boy or girl who raises the best baby beef animal this year, another to the member producing the best pig and the third to the youth growing the best dairy calf.

The scholarships, offered by the North Carolina division of the National Cottonseed Producers' Association, will be awarded under the supervision of the State College 4-H department.

The awards are intended to stimulate more interest in raising good livestock and to increase consumption of a by-product of the South's main crop—cotton.

Contestants will be required to keep accurate records showing the final weight and cost of the animal; the kind, amount, and cost of feed consumed; and the weight and value of the animal at the close of the contest.

The scholarships will be awarded on a basis of the records kept, the condition of the animal, the member's all-around participation in 4-H activities and on grooming and show man ship.

In the event that a winner is unable to apply his scholarship toward an agricultural course in college, the money will be turned over to the 4-H scholarship fund.
