Cooperative Selling Helps Hog Production

Eastern North Carolina farmers have sold \$1,500,000 worth or hogs through their local cooperative mar keting associations since January 1, more than a third 1937, said H. W. Taylor, of State College.

The 85,000 hogs sold in this way the hogs.

Although packers made deductions for soft and oily pork, Taylor added, gnowers have lost comparatively little because most of the hogs were in good condition.

The cooperative marketing program sponsored by the State College extension service is designed not only to help growers sell their hogs to advantage, but also to encourage them to produce high quality hogs.

At the first of the year 1937, two ccoperatively hog markets were func tioning in Eastern Carolina. Growers were so pleased with the results that they have organized 13 more associaions gince that time.

The extension swine specialist and county farm agents assist growers in organizing and operating an association, but the farmers themselves control its policies, Taylor

Local men have been trained grade bogs on a basis of their general quality, and arsangements have been made with the U.S. Bureau of Animal Industry to provide federal graders to determine whether the pork is hard, soft or oily.

Swine cannot be graded for soft or c'ly pork until slaughtered and cooled. Therefore, this work must be cone at the packing houses, where the federal graders will be placed as scon as men have been trained grade accurately.


