**Tar Heel Family Increases Daily**

Raleigh, May 24—Nine times every hour, day and night, some doctor or nurse in North Carolina says: "It's a boy" or "It's a girl."  
 Each day there are 216 additions to the Tar Heel family, according to the State Board of Health's vital statistics for the first four months of 1938.  
 There are approximately four deaths each hour in the State, or one every fifteen minutes. One is killed in a preventable accident about every eight hours, while somebody else cubs to cancer every five hours.  
 Each day sees an average of more than one suicide, according to the average for the past four months. Each day the number of homicides is one and a fraction and one victim of syphilis dies.

**Poppy Day Facts**

**What is Poppy Day?**  
 Poppy Day is a day observed throughout the United States by wearing memorial poppies in honor of the World War dead. It will be observed this year on May 28th, the Saturday before Memorial Day.  
**What is the Memorial Poppy?**  
 The memorial poppy is a replica of the poppies which grew on the battle fields of France and Belgium during the World War.  
**Why was the poppy chosen as the memorial flower?**  
 The poppy was chosen as the memorial flower for the World War dead because it grew where they fell the one touch of beauty in the desolate battle areas.  
**Who makes the Memorial Poppy?**  
 Memorial poppies are made by disabled World War veterans working in government hospitals and in convalescent workrooms maintained by the American Legion Auxiliary.  
**Who distributes the Memorial Poppy?**  
 Women of the American Legion Auxiliary, working as unpaid volunteers, distribute the poppies throughout the United States.  
**What is done with the money contributed for the poppies?**  
 Every penny is used to support the work of the American Legion and Auxiliary for the welfare of the disabled veterans, their families and the families of the dead.  
**Who wears the Memorial Poppy?**  
 Every American who wishes to honor the war dead and aid the war's living victims.

**To Hold Older Youth Conference At State College**

The second annual Older Youth Conference at State College will be held June 7-11, L. R. Harrill, 4-H club leader has announced.  
 The conference will be for rural boys and girls above 4-H club age who are not in college and who are too young to be served adequately by adult organizations.  
 This is a critical period in the lives of young people, Harrill said, and a program has been arranged to give inspiration and guidance at a time when it is especially needed.  
 Gov. Clyde R. Hoey heads the list of prominent speakers who are to appear on the program.  
 Brief courses in agricultural and home-making subjects will be conducted by members of the college faculty, extension service specialists and experiment station workers.  
 Rooms will be provided in the college dormitories, and meals will be served in the college cafeteria. A \$5 registration fee will cover the cost of rooms, meals, and incidentals.  
 The first Older Youth Conference was held at State College last summer, with the attendance going over 100. Indications are that a larger number will be present this time, Harrill added.
