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November Vital For Poultry

Poultrymen should be happy dur ing November. Early-hatched pullets should be in full production as that time and old hens carried over either for breeding purposes or for egg production should be coming out of the summer molt and adding their supply to the market eggs.

But poultrymen should think a head of November profits, warns Prof. Roy S. Dearstyne, head of the poultry department of State College. Winter is approaching and it brings important problems. The mild winter of last year is no guarantee of another mild winter this year, he sagely points out. These are sugges tions he makes.



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
