New York, Nov. 1.—(IPS).—Leading radio manufacturers of the nation have set a course for a new billion dollar television enterprise destined to bring new jobs directly to thousands in the industry and many others elsewhere.

As the result of a long intensive experimental period within the industry, the manufacturers have determined that television — wholly unknown a few years ago — is now a practical development. Television for home use will be ready for the market by next April.
