TOWN ORDINANCE
At a regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the Town of Kings Mountain on February 6, 1939, it was determined that certain water and sewerage extensions were necessary in the Town of Kings Mountain and in order to make said improvements, it would be necessary to issue bonds for the purpose of providing funds with which to make said improvements and upon motion of Commissioner W. K. Mauney and seconded by Commissioner J. K. Willis, the following Ordinance was introduced; and unanimously adopted:
An Ordinance to authorize the Town of Kings Mountain, North Carolina, to issue Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars of water and sewerage extension bonds.
SECTION ONE: That the Town of Kings Mountain, North Carolina do issue its bonds pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act to an amount not exceeding Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars for the purpose of improving and extending its water and sewer system.
SECTION TWO: That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bond shall be annually levied and collected.
SECTION THREE: That a statement of the debt of the municipality has been filed with the Clerk and is open to public inspection.
SECTION FOUR: That the Ordinance will take effect thirty days after the first publication unless in the meantime a petition for the submission to the voters is filed under the said Municipal Finance Act and that in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters in said municipality at an election provided for in said Municipal Finance Act.
