

Half Ton Of Water Carried For Washing

Much has been said of the drudgery of carrying buckets of water in the farm home, when no water is piped into the house. H. M. Ellis, agricultural engineer of the State College Extension Service, has figured it out that a housewife carries the equivalent of about 1,000 pounds of water — half a ton — every time the laundry work is done without a modern water system.

Here is how it worked in an actual home: A 14 quart pail was filled to the 12 quart level three times in supplying water for soaking clothes. In removing the water the pail was filled three more times, making six pailfuls of water handled. Then for heating and washing, four pailfuls were carried to the boiler on the kitchen stove (this was wintertime washing, then to the tub, then emptied out of doors, making four times three, or 12 handlings of a full pail. The first rinsing required carrying three pailfuls of water to be heated then to the tub, then emptied, making three times three, or nine pailfuls handled. For the second rinsing, four pailfuls were needed which made four times three, or 12 more handlings.

All this totals to 39 handlings of a pailful of water, and although only 14 pailfuls of water were actually used, the frequent handling was equivalent to carrying 117 gallons. Taking the weight of a gallon of water as 8 1/3 and 13 pounds, this meant carrying about 1,000 pounds of water.

Of course this was only one task involving the lifting of heavy pans of water in the home under observation, Ellis pointed out. "Is there,

therefore, any reason for a farm family not installing a low cost water system to relieve the housewife of all this drudgery?" the engineer asked.

Free Headstones For Veterans of All Wars

It has been reported to the American Legion there are a number of un-marked war veterans' graves in Kings Mountain and the surrounding communities.

The Legion is anxious to assist in getting markers for all of these un-marked graves. There are three different upright markers: one for veterans of the Confederate States, one for all veterans except those of the Civil and Spanish-American war, and one for the Civil war and Spanish-American veterans. There is also a flat marker for all veterans who served in the armed forces of the United States and the Confederate States if it is desired in place of the upright marker.

Applications should be filed with Baxter M. Hayes, Service Officer, Oils D. Green Post No. 155, and should give the following information: name of veteran, date of enlistment of known, date of discharge if known, rank and company or regiment, date of death, name of cemetery and location, and the address of the person to whom it should be shipped.

Headstones are supplied without cost by the quartermaster general of the army and are sent by prepaid freight to the railroad station nearest to the place of burial. The Government does not erect these stones. The applicant must accept the stone at the railway station and have it set up at the grave.
