4-H Church Sunday Is Planned May 14
 To emphasize spiritual development as an essential to good citizenship and good living, North Carolina 4-H Club members will sponsor 4-H Church Sunday on May 14, it was announced recently by L. E. Harrill, club leader for the State College Extension Service. It will be a Sunday set apart all over North Carolina for 4-H Club members to participate in the church services in their respective communities, he explained.
 Several methods of observing this occasion have been suggested to club members and they are expected to work out a program of participation with local ministers and other church leaders.
 Some clubs will sponsor the preparation of the Church Bulletin, which will include an explanation of 4-H Club work, or club members dressed in the distinctive club uniform will distribute it. Many ministers are expected to invite two club members to sit in the pulpit with them, a girl to read the scripture lesson and a boy to lead in prayer.
 The collection will be taken in some church by the boys, and team demonstrations are being planned by club members in other counties. The musical program for the service is being arranged by several clubs. Other groups will conduct Vesper services, the program being especially recommended for Older Youth Groups. Young Peoples' services will be sponsored by numbers of club while many will lead a Go To Church Day campaign.
 State Leader Harri has urged all clubs to beautify the church yards and to assume some responsibility for arranging flowers in the church on 4-H Church Sunday, May 14.

Taxes in State Now Equal \$646 For Each Family

Taxes paid in North Carolina for support of local, state and national governments are equal to \$646 annually for every family, in the state, a National Consumers Tax Commission survey showed today.
 "The various forms of government drain more than \$400,000,000 a year from the people of the state," the NCTC, a national women's organization opposing "consumer-penalizing taxes," declared.
 "Business and industry contribute substantially to the tax total, but a major share of the burden is paid by all families as consumers," the report added. "They pay — usually unknowingly — through taxes shifted to them in increased costs of everything they buy, including the necessities of life.
 "These shifted, or hidden, taxes are levied originally against producers and distributors and then, of necessity, passed along by each to the consumers. The indirect taxing system produces nearly twice as much revenue as all direct sources combined."
 The NCTC, a non-partisan organization with headquarters in Chicago, is waging an educational crusade through local study groups against "hidden taxes that lower living standards by raising living costs," according to Mrs. Kenneth C. Frazier, its president.
 The report said that groups already are active in 4,000 communities. About 120 in North Carolina are led by Mrs. William T. Hannah, of Waynesville, NCTC state director.
