SHELBY, N. C., Sept. 20.—Every inch of exhibit space has been taken — every concession and attraction contracted for — every premium for an aggregate of \$150,000 value has been listed, and in short every detail except those last minute items which always arise, has been completed for the opening of the greatest Cleveland County Fair in its history, at Shelby next Tuesday to continue for five days.
 The roof to the grandstand recently ripped loose by a violent windstorm will be in place for the opening day of the fair, and every department of the exposition is functioning rapidly, but smoothly, so that everything will be in order.
 The Cleveland Fair has been expanded this year. Exhibit space has been enlarged, but even with that it was necessary to turn away late comers, as the available space was not sufficient to meet the demand. The Premium list this year is the largest in the history of the fair. The attractions for the week of the fair are much larger heretofore.

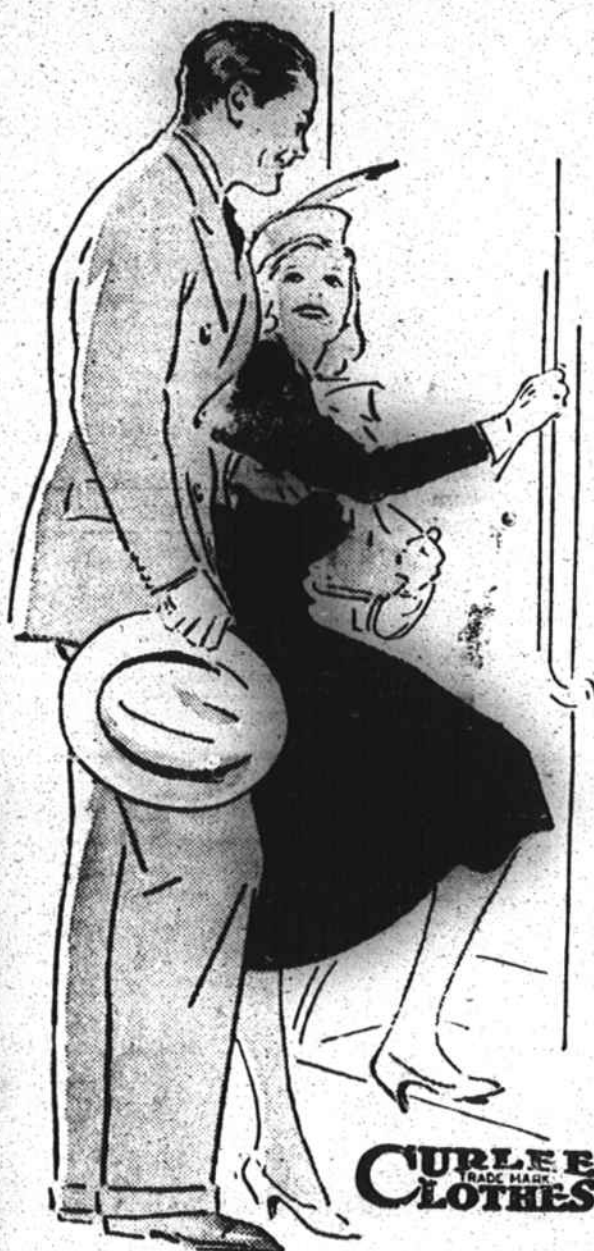
