### Radio Beams Used To Process Tobacco

Richmond, Va., Sept. 26 .- (IPS) .fing games with Gastonia a couple I: looks as though American industrial research has secred again. This this year's outfit. Seven to nothing time it's the use of short wave radio for drying tobacco by new process An engineer here has successfully removed moisture from tobacco with the aid of a 60,000 watt radio sending unit shooting radio waves throu gh the leaves.

Under the new method the tobacco is moved from the warehouse floor into hogheads, which are put in a heavy metal cylinder, which by use of steam becomes a vacuum. The radio waves are then shot thru the tobacco.
