

Mountaineers Lose Game-- Play Shelby Today

Kings Mountain's dauntless Mountaineers entertained Coach Jack Klaser's Cherryville Iron Men here last Friday by sending them home victorious, 7 to nothing.

The Mountaineers held the superior Iron Men scoreless during the first two periods of the melee, turning them back one time after penalties had taken them to the three yard line. Excessive time out had placed the Iron men within reach of pay dirt when injuries forced Captain Morrison to prolong the rest period.

The Cherryville team finally crossed the Goal line early in the final

stanza after a third period drive had placed them in scoring position.

Farthing's lead, fighting valiantly were harassed by a tickle fate twice getting into scoring position and twice losing the ball on fumbles. Injuries also played havoc with the Mountaineers with Bennett, outstanding tackle and end, suffering a broken hand, and Womack and Lynn being knocked out. Both of the latter were unaware of the fact, however, and played the majority of the game.

This afternoon the Mountaineers invade Shelby. Casey Morris' lads will be after the Mountaineers because of the defeat they suffered last year. The game will be played today instead of Friday due to a meeting of teachers in Charlotte.

With Bennett cut of the game, the Shelby team are hopeful of victory, but the Mountaineers are, despite the handicap, heavily favored to bring back the side of pork.
